- 3. That, mankind might have achieved great feats in diverse fields but the culture, tradition and values are what ultimately defines a person or community. Like wise sacredness and the culture, tradition and values that are prevalent in Dzongu is what unites all the Lepchas of the world and also gives our Identity as a distinct indigenous Tribe.
- 4. That, the very essence of being a Lepcha is derived from our Physical and spiritual connection with Dzongu.

Under the circumstances, we the Lepchas of the world cannot accept and allow the implementation of any Mega Hydro Electric Power Projects inside Dzongu. **Dzongu must be protected at all Cost** and the entire Lepchas of the world look up to you as our Protector.

Therefore, on behalf of all the Lepchas of the world, we earnestly appeal to your Honour to "**Protect the Sanctity of Dzongu**" as cited and pledged by you. In your wisdom you will clearly perceive that this can be done if only all the Mega Hydro Electric Power Projects in Dzongu are stopped.

For which act of kindness we shall always remain obliged to your honour.
